INTRODUCTORY GENEALOGY COURSE

OFFERED THIS SPRING!

The Simsbury Genealogical and Historical Research Library will be offering an introductory genealogy course through the Simsbury School of Continuing Education. The course will run for six weeks (March 7-April 11, 1996) on Thursday evenings from 7:30 - 9:00 PM. Held at the Simsbury Free Library, it will offer a hands on approach to genealogical research. Students will learn basic research techniques, record keeping and computer use in genealogical inquiry. The Internet, on-line bulletin boards and genealogical software will be covered. Guest lecturers will cover specific topics. The instructor will be Dawn Hutchins Bobryk, a member of the Library, and family history researcher for nearly twenty years. The cost of the course is \$40 which includes materials and a six month membership to the Research Library. Class size is limited to 12.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

We are looking for volunteers to help with this course. No matter what your level of expertise you can help the Library by attending all or some classes and providing personalized attention for the students. Whether it's threading microfilm or helping with the IGI files we will need additional support for this project. We would like to have 3-5 members at each session. Sign-up sheets will be available after the first of the year. We hope to make this an on going project that will introduce the community to the joys of genealogy and the great resource they have in our library.

THE DOUBLE FIRST COUSIN FAMILIES OF SWEETNAM/VARIAN OF MANISTEE, MICHIGAN AND EDGERTON, OHIO

My cousin, Marion Henry of Manistee, Michigan, had mentioned it once but I was too involved in my own research to give it any notice and so a crumbling obituary from 1917 lay unexplored in her massive collection of family memorabilia. Recently, I was bemoaning the dead-end I seemed to have reached in finding our connection the Sweetnam families in Ireland, when Marion again asked me what I had done about the double first cousins of her grandmother who she knew nothing about except references made to them by her mother. "Double first cousins," I gasped, "that would mean two siblings married two siblings. Send me the obituary right away!"

Within weeks, I had, with the help of the Albion, Michigan Town Hall and Public Library, reconstructed the family of Susan Elizabeth Sweetnam Burns [b. 5 Apr 1862 in Edgerton, Ohio], the double first cousin of Marion's grandmother Susan Anna Sweetnam Wilcox and my great grandmother, Sarah Isabella Sweetnam Hutchins. As luck would have it, Susan Elizabeth married a Methodist minister, Andrew Wellwood Burns, and both had formal biographies published in the proceedings of the Methodist Conference in Michigan. That gave the names of Susan Elizabeth's parents, John Sweetnam and Susan Varian who settled in Edgerton, Ohio. Rather quickly the pieces fell into place and I had assembled a family that mirrored that of my great-great grandparents, George Austin Sweetnam and Charlotte Elizabeth Varian who settled in Manistee, Michigan.

Both the Sweetnam brothers and the Varian sisters came to the United States from Western County Cork in Ireland. From the records we have it would appear that George Austin Sweetnam came over in 1849 as a bachelor and married Charlotte Elizabeth Varian about 1853 either in New York State or Ohio. John Sweetnam left his wife, Susan Varian Sweetnam, in Ireland with their first four children in 1850 and made his way to New York State. She followed him in 1854 after he was settled in Ohio. The two families were together for a time in and around Bryan, Ohio then George Austin Sweetnam sets off with his family for Wisconsin and finally Michigan.

More research has followed and connections have been made, including five "cousins" from the Ohio branch. This week we discovered that our "Susie" had listed **Bryan**, Ohio (some ten miles from **Edgerton**) as her birthplace on her marriage license rather than **New York State** as had been on Federal Census records. A new scenario has unfolded in the migration pattern of the family. All this because of an old obituary with "double first cousin" written in pencil in the border - left behind by a generation which was in contact with them.
